

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Will I be teaching from day one?

Training will be tailored to fit your needs. If you have had no previous experience in education, you will spend more time observing other teachers and will be gradually integrated into the classroom when you and your mentor feel that it is appropriate.

If you have taught before, you may want to teach from the start of the training period. This can be arranged in discussion with your mentor.

Who will be involved in my training?

You will come into contact with a wide range of people during your training period. Your mentor will be the most immediate point of contact, but you will also be supported by other teachers from your department as well as Advanced Skills Teachers. As part of the Professional Development programme, members of staff with particular specialisms deliver the various sessions and will be able to advise you on key areas of teaching.

What is the advantage of training on the Graduate Teacher Programme at the Beauchamp Partnership?
