UNIFORM POLICY

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Principles

It is our policy that students in KS3 at Beauchamp are required to wear a uniform that fosters a sense of identity while allowing some personal choice. It is our policy that in all Key Stages students at Beauchamp College should wear clothing that is in keeping with a purposeful learning ethos. We also believe it is important that certain activities are facilitated by specialised and appropriate clothing when attending school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours. We provide a complete list of the items needed for student's school uniform in this policy.

Aims

Our policy for student's school uniform is based on the belief that a school uniform promotes a sense of pride in the school, engenders a feeling of community and belonging, is practical and smart, identifies the students with the school, is not distracting in class (as fashion clothes might be), makes students feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance, is regarded as suitable, and good value for money, by most parents, and has been designed with health and safety in mind.

Uniform Costs

We strive to keep the cost of our school uniform to a minimum for parents. Of the compulsory uniform, only the school jumper or blazer and PE sports top is school-specific; all other items can be purchased from a variety of retail outlets. Arrangements are in place for parents to acquire second hand uniform items. The school can provide advice and support to help parents on a low income through communication with pastoral teams.

Supplier

Our uniform supplier is Stevensons. They have been selected as our supplier for cost and quality of uniform. All items can be purchased from their website for home delivery:

Compulsory Uniform

School Blazer or School Jumper

Either a navy Beauchamp blazer (or equivalent with a Beauchamp badge) or a blue or grey jumper with the Beauchamp logo

Beauchamp Clip-On Tie

To be always worn

A White Shirt

A plain, white or tailored shirt or blouse with a collar. This should be tucked in at all times.



Lanyard

This must include the ID card and be worn at all times

Charcoal Grey School Trousers or Charcoal Grey Pleated Skirt or Charcoal Grey Shorts

Trousers should **not** be:

- Jeans/jeans style
 - Leggings/jeggings
 - Jogging bottoms
 - Cropped or rolled up
 - Skinny leg
 - Combats
 - Have large belts
- Skirts **must** be:
- Knee length
 - Worn with plain black, blue or grey tights or ankle length socks

Black Shoes or Trainers

All black shoes or trainers with black soles (no high heels or fashion shoes)

Dance/P.E. Kit

Students are expected to wear any of the following appropriate clothing for their PE lessons:

Clothing

- Royal blue t-shirt
- Royal blue jumper (Optional)
- Navy or black shorts or tracksuit bottoms/sports leggings
- Navy football socks

Footwear

Trainers

- Moulded firm ground studded boots (for the new 3G astroturf)
- Studded boots for field (Optional)

We strongly recommend that students wear studded footwear and shin pads for activities on the playing fields and that a gum shield is worn when playing rugby and hockey.

Optional Uniform

A waterproof outdoor coat - no hoodies, sweatshirts or denim

Head/Hair Wear

Plain black or white headscarf

Plain black or white hair bands, bobbles and clips

Appearance Guidelines

- Only one small stud earring per ear
- No facial piercings
- Modest make-up
- No long or false nails
- No fake eyelashes or lash strips
- No extreme hair colouring
- Sensible coats or jackets

Non-Uniform Days

Throughout the year, students will have opportunities to wear non-school uniforms.

Guidelines will be provided, and students are expected to dress sensibly and appropriately.

Pre-Loved Uniform

To support families, Beauchamp offers a pre-loved uniform scheme. Parents/carers can access a stock of pre-loved blazers, jumpers, and shirts.

Equipment

At Beauchamp College we teach pupils they should be ready to work hard in lessons. This includes being fully equipped for lessons. At all times, students should have a reading book in their school bag, and a pencil case containing at least:

- A black/blue/green pen
- Pencil
- Ruler
- Rubber
- Sharpener
- Compass
- Protractor
- Calculator
- Glue stick
- School bag (large enough for A4 books)
- School Planner
