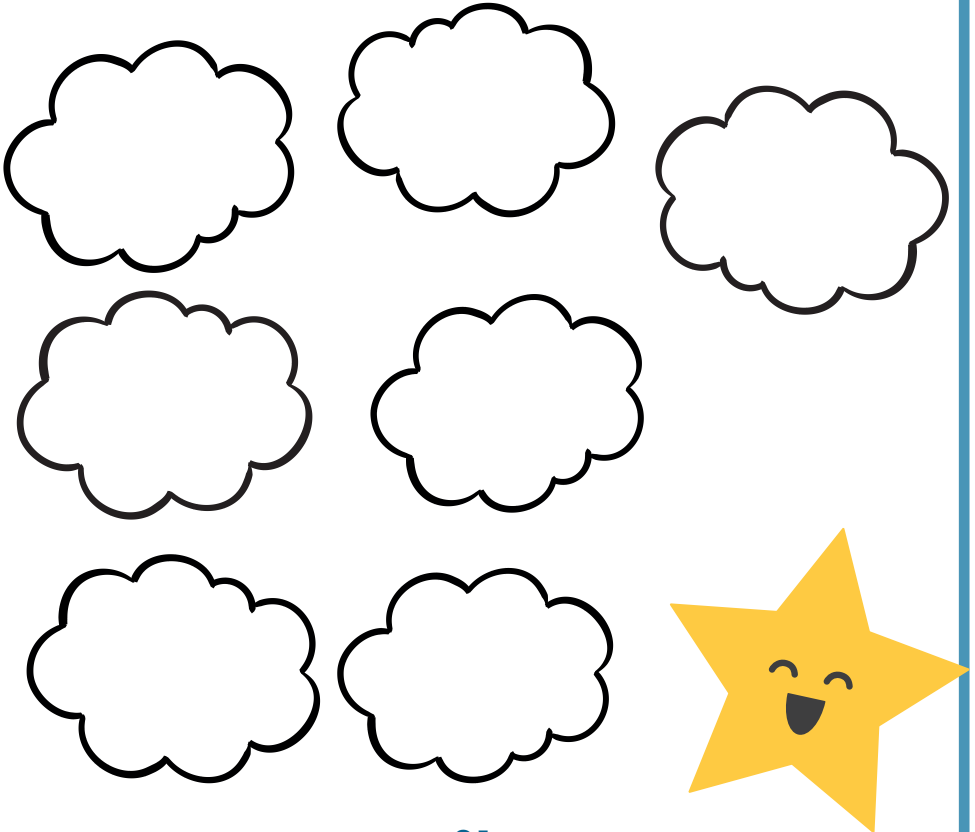


Extra-curricular activities
