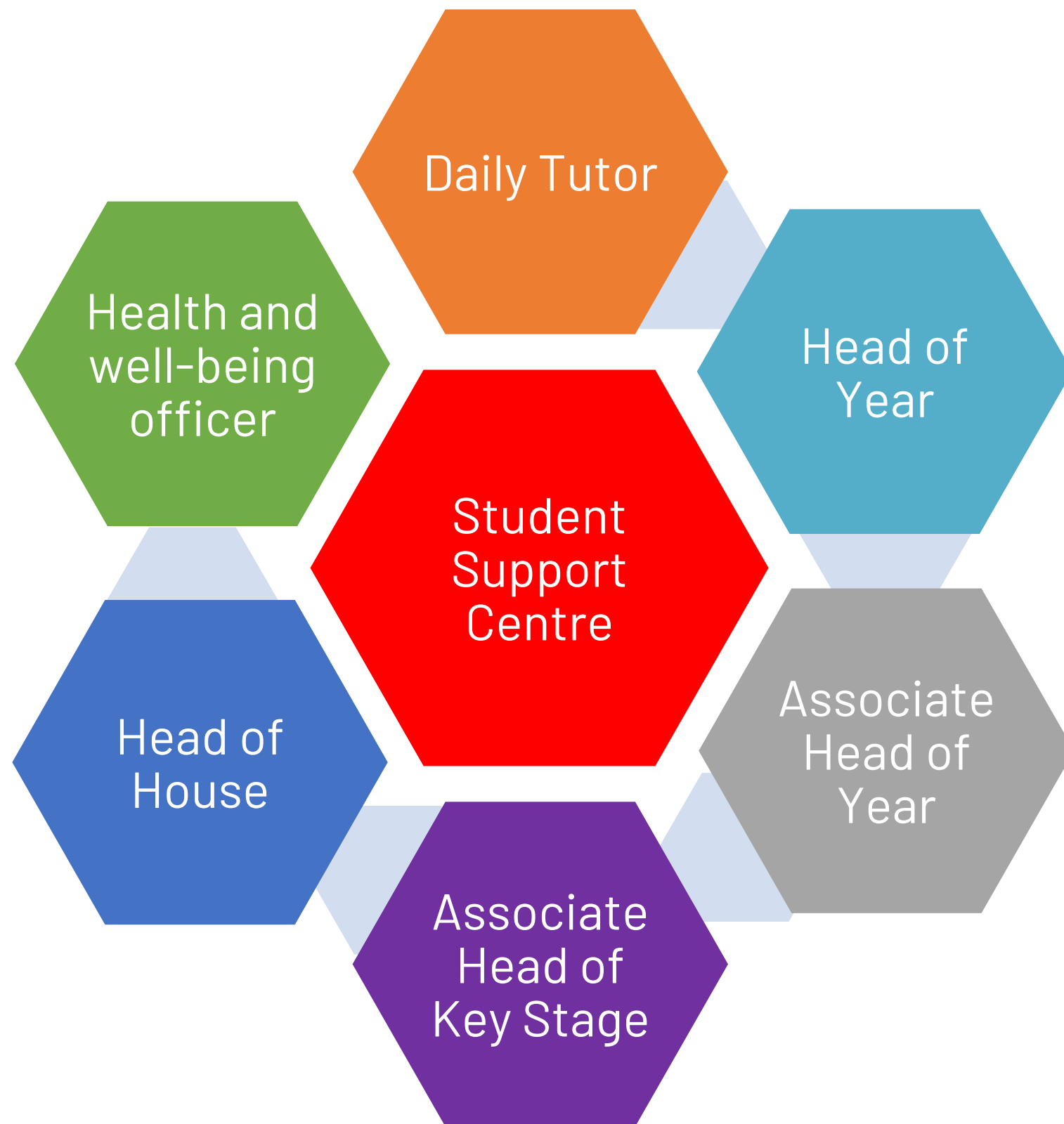

- Key stage 3 Uniform

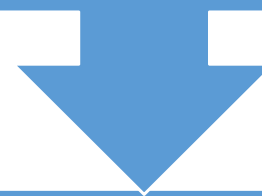


- Our Key stage 3 uniform consists of:
- Charcoal grey trousers/**knee length charcoal grey pleated skirt**/charcoal grey tailored shorts
- White shirt and blue striped tie
- Choice of school jumper: grey or navy (with school logo)

- All black shoes or all black trainers (black soles)
- No make-up, no false nails, no extreme hair colourings
- Only one small stud earring to be worn in each ear - students should not be wearing excessive amounts of jewellery

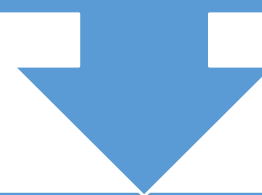
Pupil-centred and Positive - our morning routine



Our site is open from 7.45am with breakfast club

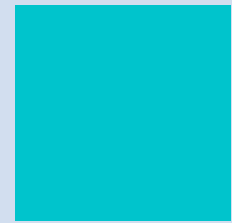


Lessons start promptly at 8.35am and students should be at their period 1 classroom door at 8.30am waiting to go in.

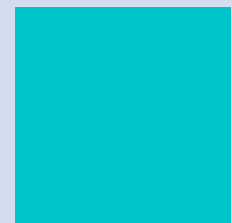

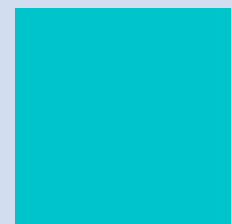
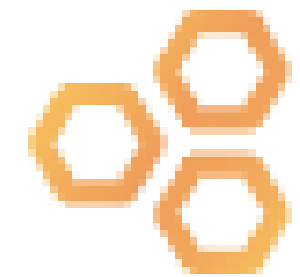

- Children in receipt of Free School Meals will have their lunch money automatically uploaded to their Smart Card every day.

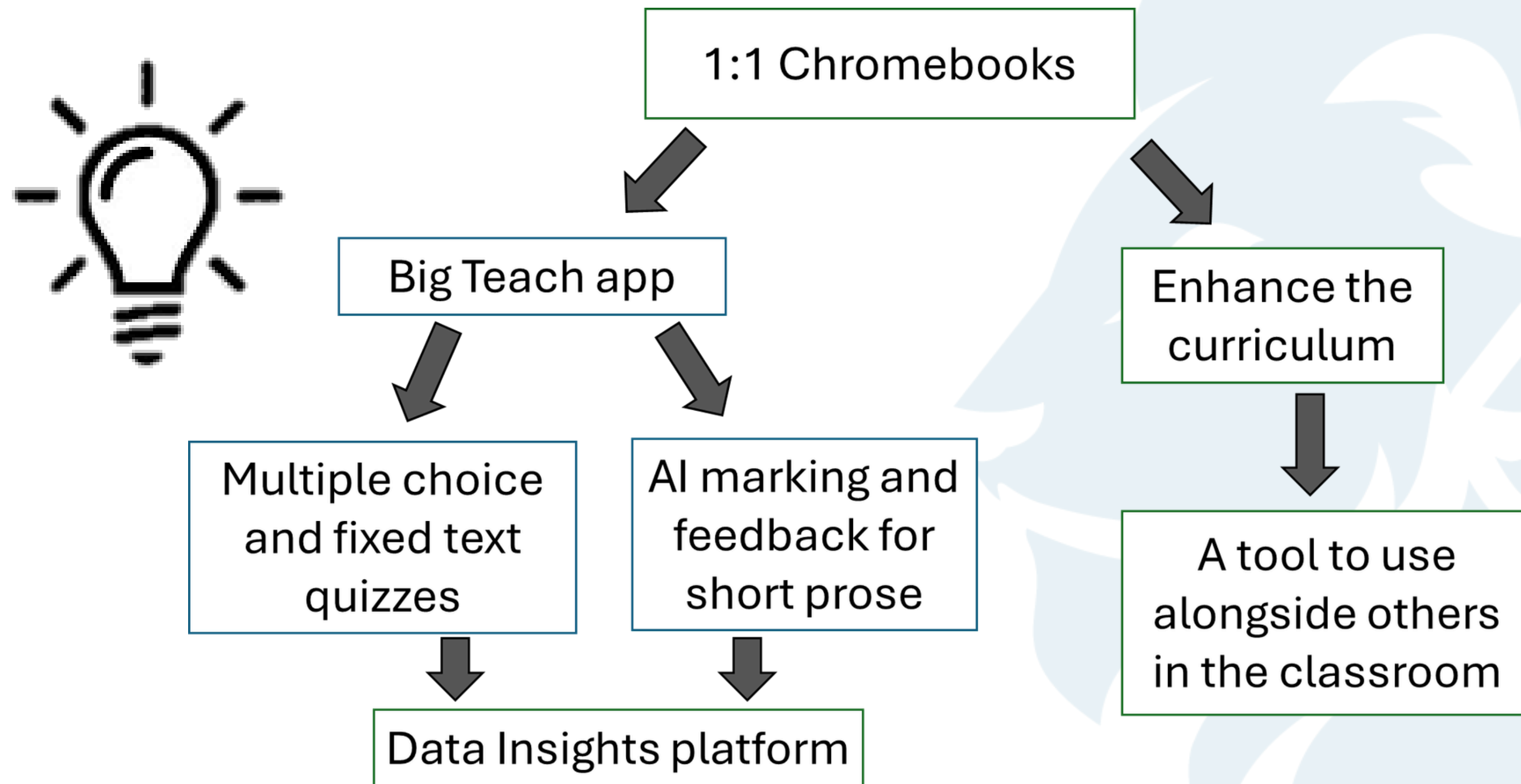
Updates to FSM nationally



- September 2026, all families who receive Universal Credit will be able to apply for free school meals
- Not all students who are in receipt of FSM will be eligible for the Pupil Premium grant from now on

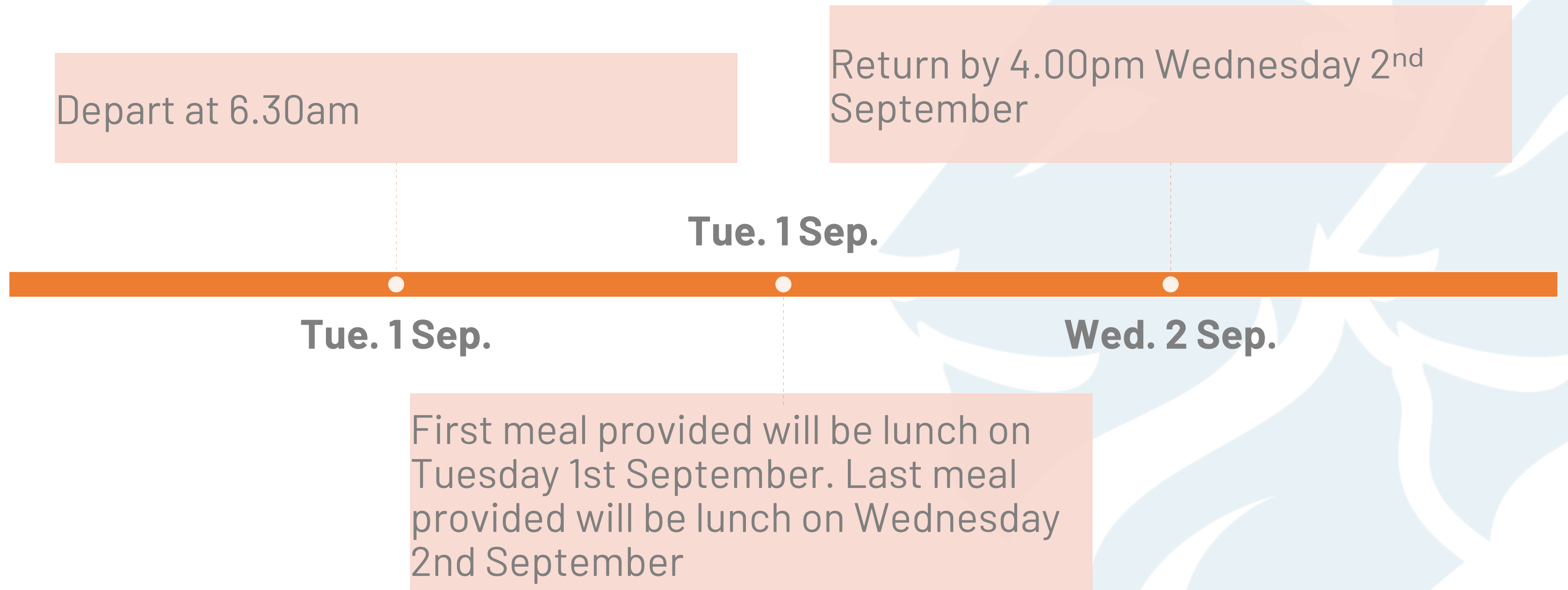

Packing list

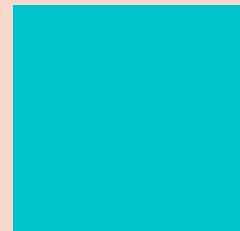


Students are responsible for their own belongings, so bring only what is necessary.

SUGGESTED KIT LIST:	
Pack	Clothes for Activities
	2 or 3 pairs of trousers – tracksuit bottoms are best for activities. Jeans are unsuitable and impractical for wearing during activities as when they get wet they are very heavy and also take a long time to dry! May wish to pack jeans for final evening
	2 pairs of thick socks (such as ski socks or walking socks)
	2 pairs of thin socks (not the short trainer socks)
	2 warm long sleeved sweatshirts, fleeces or sweaters
	2 or 3 t-shirts/thermal tops and 1 or 2 long sleeve t-shirts
	Waterproof jacket or coat
	A pair of walking boots or sturdy waterproof trainers/old trainers
	1 pair of normal trainers
	Swimwear and clothing to wear on top for water based activity
	Other Essential & Useful Items:
	Sleeping Bag
	Small pillow/cushion
	Underwear for each day
	2 good sized towels
	Leisurewear for evenings
	Any personal medication
	Socks (not for activities)
	Plasters for blisters!

	A bin liner for damp clothes
